Dear Friends,

Actually, with the resurrection of Jesus, God's kingdom has already been ushered in. Jesus remains present and Lord of our lives. And just like in the garden, God still counts on us to be good stewards here on earth in this time and place. After all, we are made in God's image because we are meant to care for creation and draw it close to our creator. And through Jesus' death and resurrection, God's long-awaited Kingdom is already here. Therefore, we need to take seriously our call to be builders of the kingdom, and not hold back. Just as our two congregations are being made new, God's work of re-creation has begun! Anything you do in the name of Christ is not wasted but so important!

Paul worked hard with the Corinthian church. Often, the world would distract them, cause them to fight, pull them in another direction and cause them to doubt. But we are doing the work, my friends. And as God's New Creation, we already are understanding the strong values that have resulted in fruitful ministry involving Hospitality, Helping Others, Faithfulness and in the ways we are Prayerful.

So like Paul, hear my encouragement to keep up the good work - New Creation people! Your labor is not in vain. God wants to use you for this kingdom now. For the kingdom is not some far-distant goal or promise, IT IS HERE! May you find yourself growing stronger in your building skills as we move forward in this newly created time for our church with the many ways we can spread the Good News!


RACIAL EQUITY TRAINING OFFERED



Racism has caused suffering for many years, yet many people don't know very much about why or how this happened. The Racial Equity Team of our synod will offer a six-hour workshop in October led by Dr. Joyce Caldwell and Rev. Marilyn Miller of Leading for Racial Equity of Milwaukee.

Caldwell and Miller provided anti-racism training for lay and rostered people several years ago in virtual format due to COVID 19. Their workshops have been very well received here and throughout the region, and Caldwell and Miller are recognized as national leaders in this work. Participants may choose to attend either session: Friday, October 14 at Lutheran Church of the Wilderness or Saturday, October 15 at St. John Lutheran in Ashwaubenon. Ideally, participants will attend with one or two others from their congregation, ministry, or organization including a council or board member. Youth aged 13 and older are welcome as part of the team. Time will be included for these groups to discuss how to take this information back to their congregations, ministries, or organizations. LAY SCHOOL: EDUCATION FOR ALL



Registration for Lay School continues! Throughout August we will continue to feature courses. This Introduction week, to New Testament! **Introduction to the New Testament: The goals of this course are to gain a working knowledge of the content of the New Testament, a basic understanding of its socio-historical background and an awareness of how the New Testament came into being. The student will develop skills in reading biblical texts while exploring the various Gospel portrayals of Jesus. Students will use the knowledge to grow in confidence in proclaiming the Gospel to others. Students will also explore key theological concepts such as grace, justification, the theology of the cross and stewardship. The instructional method will encourage students to grow in love and excitement in the reading and study of the Bible. Pastor Ryan Eikenberry will teach this course and is the Faith Life Pastor at First English Lutheran in Appleton, WI.



2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly: Members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) gathered for the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly Aug. 8-12 at the Greater Columbus Convention Center in Columbus, Ohio. Meeting under the theme "Embody the Word," the assembly participated in plenary discussions to make decisions about the work of this church. They also spent time in worship and Bible study.

The triennial gathering — the highest legislative body of the denomination — was composed of more than 900 voting members serving on behalf of the 3.3 million members of the ELCA. The ELCA's 65 synods elected voting members to serve at churchwide assemblies. See the Synod website for more information.

MATCHING FUNDS FUNDRAISER:

To date, we have received pledges of seed money totaling \$20,205. We have 100% buy-in from the members of both councils, and 3 pledges were received from other generous donors.

We have done our best to explain that all checks for matching funds should be made payable to Our Savior's and should be clearly marked as Matching Funds. All the donors have followed these instructions. Any Christ Lutheran members who donate matching funds have been set up with a giving record for Our Savior's, and they will receive 2 giving records at the end of this year – one

from each congregation. Several pledgers of seed money have already donated their funds. The total received, so far, from them is \$18,030. The total received in matching funds (through Sunday, August 21) is \$4,655.20. There are 25 matching funds donors thus far. This includes 5 people who gave using Vanco. Some of their amounts were adjusted because of charge card processing discounts. Five of the donors are from Christ Lutheran, one of whom isn't a member but maintains ties because of his deceased parents. Three other donors are not officially members of the congregation.
