"What is the kingdom of God like? And to what should I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden;

Luke 13:18-19



I love the parables of Jesus. This particular one brought so much imagery to my mind. As I look outside, I see the birds begin to flock. They are gathering as a community in order to make a big move. And how about us? What is our next big move? Yes, we've settled in after the hard work of consolidation. Now, many are working hard at giving our interior a facelift. But really, now what?

The Parables of the Mustard Seed describe the growth and spreading influence of the church. The parable of the mustard seed is about outward growth. Birds from outside fly into and become part of the tree. The tree is now large enough to sustain life around it. I think back to how we've grown in so many ways. And remember this, growth of the kingdom comes from small beginnings.

You will be hearing from our church council this month on how they feel we might answer some of those questions. I ask that you pray on these questions for now. Then, trust that God will answer.

This is both an exciting and challenging time to be church. We've seen God take the smallest of dreams and produce something fruitful with it. I believe that it's time again to remember the faithfulness of God as we move forward in this new time together.


